**October 4** – *La Americana* is the touching, politically relevant story of a young mother who emigrates from South America to the United States in order to pay her daughter's medical bills.

**October 11** – *Food, Inc.* explores where the food we purchase at the grocery store really comes from, and what it means for the health of future generations. This film exposes the comfortable relationships between business and government in the American food industry.

**October 18** – *No Tomorrow*. When a young woman featured in a recent documentary is brutally murdered, the film itself becomes central to whether the killer lives or dies. This story offers a unique window into the controversies surrounding the death penalty.
