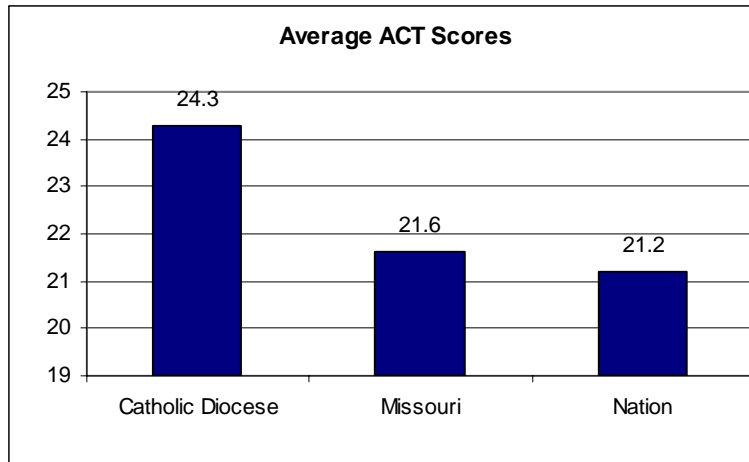

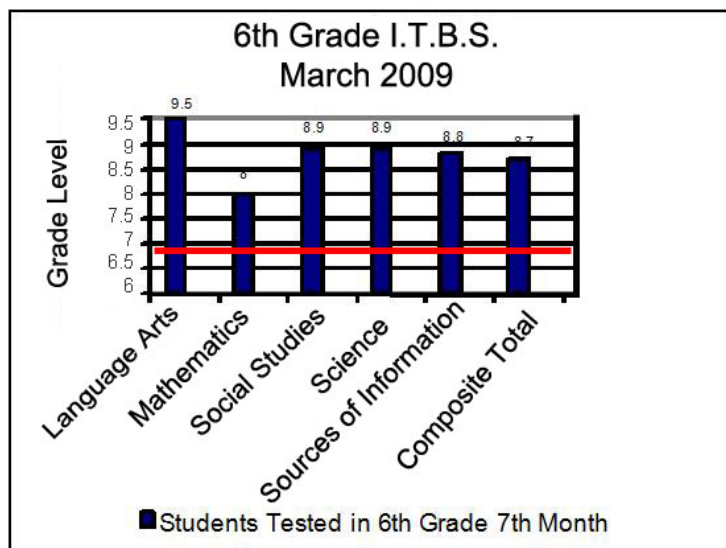
We Measure Up ~ ACT

Iowa Tests of Basic Skills

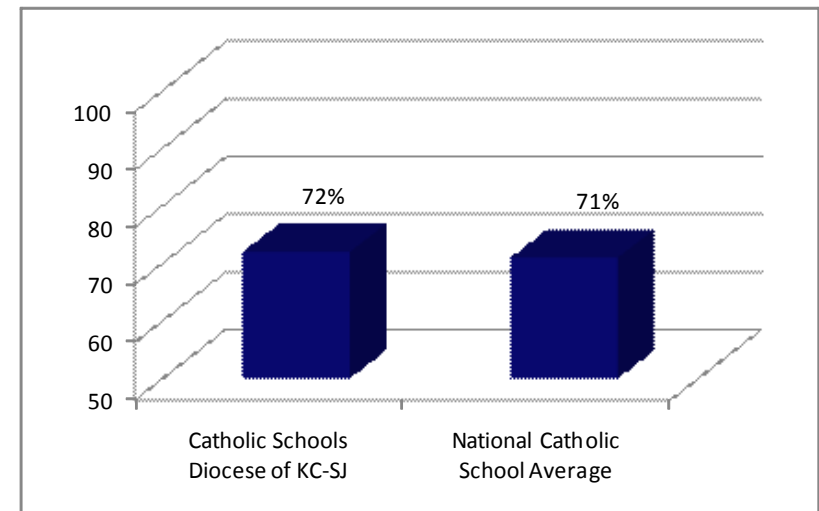
The Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) are national standardized tests administered annually in the Diocese. The tests offer one measurement of progress.



Diocese Administers ACRE Test

The Assessment of Catholic Religious Education (ACRE) measures knowledge of the faith as well as beliefs, behaviors, attitudes and practices of the faith. ACRE carries the endorsement of the NCEA and is based upon the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Students take the ACRE test in the 5th and 8th grades.
